SUBJECT: Burbank Hospitality Association Meeting – August 10, 2022

**SUBJECT:** Meeting Synopsis for the Board of Building and Fire Code Appeals – September 8, 2022

- Staff provided an overview of the 2022 California Building and Fire Standards Code, and proposed three local amendments: Appendix P on Emergency Housing, Cool Roof Standards, and Electric Vehicle Charging Stations for new construction.
- Staff reminded the Board that the 2022 California Building Standards Code will go into effect on January 1, 2023 in its base form regardless of a formal adoption by the City.
- Fire Battalion Chief Dave Burke discussed changes to the 2022 California Fire Code, which included the definitions of lithium batteries, requirements of smoke detection systems, and anchorage requirements for inflatable amusement structures.
- The Board made a motion recommending that City Council adopt the 2022 California Building and Fire Standards Code with local amendments.
