

Recruitment Plan Update - Police Recruit/Police Officer


There are currently eight (8) Police Recruit/Police Officer vacancies. There was one candidate hired this month. As indicated above, the recruitment for Police Recruit/Police Officer is open continuously. Physical agility examinations will continue to occur once a month and our pace is to complete 12 this year.

Currently there are seven (7) candidates in the onboarding process and following are updates for Police Recruits attending police academies:

• Six (6) Police Recruits are attending the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department Academy. Three (3) are scheduled to graduate in January 2024, two (2) in March 2024, and one (1) in April 2024.

SUBJECT: Information on Sandbag Deployment

BACKGROUND

During Tropical Storm Hilary in August, there were several complaints from the public that sandbags were not available at the Public Works Yard (Yard). This is a follow-up memo to help explain what happened at that time as well as Public Works' overall public assistance strategy for sandbags during the wet and dry seasons.

Sandbags are typically made available to residents for emergency purposes during the rainy season (generally October to April) and Public Works typically has approximately 2,000 on hand during those months and about 1,000 at other times. The stock of 2,000 served as a good baseline during the 2017 through 2020 mudflows caused by the La Tuna Fire and is what can be feasibly stored in the Yard. Sandbags are also maintained at that level to ensure they are deployed before the liners degradate and become unusable.

On the **Public** Works' Street Maintenance Flood Control webpage (https://www.burbankca.gov/web/public-works/flood-control), it is recommended that residents obtain sandbags at local home improvement stores or online retailers, noting that the sandbags available at the Yard are emergency resources. Additionally, residents and business owners are reminded that early preparation is the most effective way to protect properties; for example, clearing their properties' drainage benches, gutters and roof drains, and checking sump pumps and drain lines to subterranean parking areas prior to storm events.

If significant rain is forecasted, Burbank residents and businesses may receive up to 25 sandbags (with proof of residency and while supplies last), depending upon the number in stock at the time. Numbers are limited as supplies get low. The sandbags are available 48 hours prior to the rain event from 8:00AM to 3:00PM Monday through Friday, and over the weekend if the event is slated early the following week.

DISCUSSION

Tropical Storm Hilary was forecasted to pass over Burbank on the weekend of August 20th. In preparation of the storm, Public Works staged the existing stock of sandbags to distribute to the public. Staff assessed how many could be distributed of the ~1,000 on hand based upon the Department's own forecasted needs, and began passing them out.

On Thursday and Friday August 17th and 18th, 871 sandbags were passed out to 62 residents until 4:00pm, past the normal service time. After the Yard closed on Friday, another 240 sandbags we left on palettes for residents to pick up on their own outside the gates. Given the minimal amount and after-hours distribution, coupled with the fact that there are no security cameras or a guard shack, staff believes individuals may have taken more than their fair share. Staff determined that the 240 sandbags had been taken in only a couple of hours on Friday afternoon based upon the time complaints started.

CONCLUSION

Public Works consistently encourages residents to plan for rain events and disasters by obtaining sandbags in advance of wet weather. During this unusual summer rain event, Public Works provided emergency sandbags for the residents as is done during winter rain events. Since the allotment of sandbags available to the public had not been exhausted, they were placed outside the gates for those that had not planned ahead and unfortunately appear to have been taken by only a few members of the public.

Public Works closely collaborates with the Emergency Management Coordinator and the Public Information Office to ensure proper preparation and messaging for pending storm events to ensure the general public understands their (and Public Works) role in preparing for significant rain events. We will ensure this level of preparation and messaging occurs in the future during dry season forecasts for significant rainfall as well going forward, and will carefully consider the need to staff sandbag dispersal in the future as opposed to leaving them openly available to the public outside the gates.
