

75 Years of Compassionate Care

- Saint Joseph Hospital was founded by the Sisters of Providence in 1944 in response to a growing need for hospital beds in the San Fernando Valley
- Remain faithful to serving all especially the poor and vulnerable – and follow the mission set forth by the Sisters of Providence



Current State of Emergency Department

- Over 70,000 patient visits in 2018
- Consistent year-over-year increases in number of visits
- Current emergency department was built in 1981
- Constrained space requires patients being treated in the hallway







Right-Sizing Our Emergency Department

Current

- 13,800 square feet
- 44 beds total:
 - 24 beds separated by curtains
 - 8 hallway beds (used daily)
 - 10-12 surge beds
- No Urgent Care on site

Replacement

- 34,500 square feet
- 44 beds all private rooms
- Improved Fast Track and triage areas
- Dedicated imaging lab
- Separate Urgent Care

Project Cost and Funding

- \$78 million project
- 100 percent funded through community donors

Proposed Project Timeline

- Pre-Design/Prepare Project Plans 6 months
 - Began Summer 2018
- City of Burbank Design Review/Permitting 9 months
 - Submitted Application: September 4, 2018
 - Anticipated Permit Decision: On or after May 24, 2019
- State Review/Permitting for Emergency Department (OSPHD) 9 months
 - Submitted Application: April 2019
 - Simultaneous review/permitting of construction drawings for Urgent Care by City
- Project Construction Up to 1.5 Years
 - Begin Site Preparation: Spring 2019
 - Anticipated Construction Completion: Late 2021
