

CURBSIDE PICK UP: WHAT GOES IN THE RECYCLING CONTAINERS

Keep'em I-O-O-S-e Please don't bag recyclables.

PAPER



Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, phone books, office paper, envelopes *(plastic removed)*, junk mail, ads, cardboard *(flattened)*, paper bags, paperback books, etc.

NO plastic, laminated, food soiled, or waxed.

METAL

Emptied and rinsed aluminum, tin or steel items (*Rinsed foil products and metal lids allowed*)

Hazardous aerosols and tanks not accepted. (See Weekend Drop Off: LA S.A.F.E. Collection Center section).

GLASS - LIDS REMOVED

Bottles and jars. *Emptied and rinsed NO drinking glasses, ceramics, dishes, mirrors, window glass, or light bulbs.*

PLASTIC - CAPS ON!

Soda bottles, water bottles, detergent bottles, milk and water jugs, juice bottles, tubs, and dairy containers.

Only plastics with the following symbols:





Now accepting CLEAR #1 clamshells, take out containers and cups.

WHAT DOES NOT GO IN THE RECYCLE CONTAINERS?



• NO Plastics with the following symbols:



- NO Black or #6 take out containers
- NO Foamed polystyrene (Styrofoam[™])
- NO Plastic bags Return bags to stores. Go to www.plasticfilmrecycling.org/recycling
- NO Toys
 Donate to others.
- NO Shredded paper See Burbank Recycle Center drop off section.
- NO Cartons, ice cream, boxed beverages, or frozen food boxes
- NO Wrappers or snack bags, pouches
- NO Coffee cups
- NO Food soiled, dirty or wet paper and cardboard
- NO Yard trimmings, leaves, or plants
- NO Wood products, lumber, furniture
- NO Tires or rubber materials Check with local tire shops about recycling tires.

NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Paints, solvents, cleaning products, pool and garden chemicals, medicine, sharps (needles), thermostats, tanks, ammunition, **batteries**, etc.

Batteries can cause fires in collection trucks during transportation. Batteries must be dropped off for responsible disposal – See Drop Zone section.

Hazardous Waste is accepted at LA S.A.F.E. Collecton Centers. (See Weekend Drop Off: LA S.A.F.E. Collection Center section)

We accept all curbside recyclable materials as well as:



SCRAP METAL

Metal sheets, hinges, doors, tools, curtain rods, chairs, etc. *Remove attached wood or plastic*



PLASTICS දා දා දා

Large plastics like storage containers, laundry baskets, buckets, trash cans

NO plastic bags, toys, PVC pipe, foam polystyrene (Styrofoam™)



SHREDDED PAPER

Collected in plastic bag otherwise too difficult to recover



EYEGLASSES

Lions Club collection drop off site at Recycle Center office. M-F 10a-5p. *No eyeglass cases.* More info: lionsclub.org



MATTRESSES

One mattress and box spring or futon pad per year. *Must be dry and insect-free.*

NOT ACCEPTED AT THE BURBANK RECYCLE CENTER

- Wood, yard trimmings and other organics
- Children's car seats
- Large Appliances
- Furniture

- Paint, solvents
- Videos, CDs, DVDs
- Trash
- Hazardous waste

Please consider reuse, re-purposing or donation over disposal

SPECIAL ELECTRONICS AND MOTOR OIL DROP OFF

Accepted for drop off in limited quantities; Burbank I.D. required



ELECTRONIC WASTE

Computers, DVD players, phones, televisions, microwaves and small appliances. *Limit 100 lbs per year.*

HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES

Place in plastic bags for drop off. Learn more about safe battery handling at Call2Recycle.org *Limit 10 lbs per year.*

FLUORESCENT LIGHTS

Tubes and compact lights. Limit 10 bulbs per year.

TONER CARTRIDGES

Used non-refurbished printer and toner cartridges. No boxes.

BUSINESS WASTE

Same guidelines apply for Burbank businesses with small amounts. Consider hiring a professional disposal service for larger amounts.

Oil Drop off: Burbank I.D. not required



USED MOTOR OIL & ANTIFREEZE

Waste motor oil, antifreeze, and used oil filters. Waste oil dropoff is limited to 20 gallons per trip.


- Oil cannot be mixed with dirt, water, solvents, gasoline, diesel, etc. (No cooking oil)
- If payment is desired, notify an attendant before draining container
- Please reuse your bucket after draining

S.A.F.E. Centers are operated by the City of Los Angeles, LA Sanitation.

LA Sanitation Rules and Regulations apply. Anyone who violates the rules may be rejected.

ACCEPTED

Paint and solvents; used motor oil and filters, antifreeze, and other automotive fluids; cleaning products; pool and garden chemicals; aerosol cans; all medicine; auto batteries; household (alkaline) batteries; fluorescent tubes and bulbs, thermostats, and other mercurycontaining lamps; computers, monitors, printers, network equipment, cables, telephones, televisions, microwaves, video games, cell phones, radios, stereos, VCRs & DVD players, and electronic toys.

NOT ACCEPTED

Business waste, ammunition, EXPLOSIVES, radioactive materials, biological waste or tires; no bulky items: furniture, refrigerators, washing machines, clothes dryers, conventional ovens, paper, or computer software.

NO BUSINESS WASTE ACCEPTED

Avoid contaminating recycling with these tips:

Beware of Deceptive Packaging Claims: "Recyclable" is not the same as 'able to be recycled"

Reduce and Reuse then Recycle: Avoid single use disposable items wherever possible; adopt reusable habits

Uncoated Paper is Best: If You Can Rip It, You Can Recycle It!

No Tanglers:

Cords, rope, garden hoses, chains, and plastic bags (film) material damage our sorting machines.

Cardboard:

Flatten boxes and remove packaging contents

Keep It Clean:

Only dry materials free of grease, food and liquids to prevent contamination

Tiny Plastics Aren't Recyclable: Plastics less than 3" fall through sorting machines

Keep Lids on Plastic Containers: Orphaned caps become litter and trash

Avoid Mixed Materials:

Packaging that combines different materials (ex: paper padded bubble wrap envelope) has no market, so not recyclable.

Drop Off Glass at Burbank Recycle Center: While bottles and jars are allowed in mixed curbside recycling, keeping glass colors separate holds its value

Shred Only Vital Docs:

Shredding shortens fibers and lessens paper's value **Spread the Word:**
