WHAT TO EXPECT:

- Be prepared to **provide your home address** and complete a short survey upon arrival
- HHW/E-Waste must be **transported securely in the trunk** of your vehicle and separated from personal belongings
- You'll be asked to **remain in your vehicle at all times** during the unloading process

A maximum of 15 gallons or 125 pounds of hazardous waste can be transported per trip.

What is HHW? Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) is any product labeled toxic, poisonous, corrosive, flammable, combustible or irritant.

NOTE: All waste collection services are suspended during rainy weather.

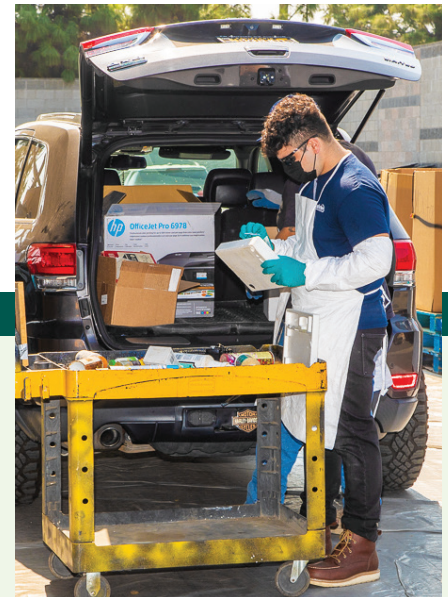

Very Small Quantity Generator (VSQG) Program

The **VSQG Program** provides a legal and affordable hazardous waste management solution to qualified entities. A disposal fee will be charged based on the type and amount of waste.



VSQGs can drop off materials at their desired **S.A.F.E. Center** location. Visit www.lacitysan.org/safecenters for a list of locations and hours. The City of Los Angeles and Clean Harbors Environmental Services have partnered up to provide businesses with hazardous waste recycling and disposal service. Who qualifies for the VSQG Program?

Businesses that generate no more than 27 gallons or 220 pounds of hazardous waste, or 2.2 pounds of extremely hazardous waste, per month are "Very Small Quantity Generators" or VSQGs.

The business must be located within the County of Los Angeles. Latex and oil-based paints, as well as Universal Wastes (fluorescent lights, batteries and electronics) are not subject to the weight or quantity limits; Department of Transportation hazardous materials limits still apply when transporting waste to a S.A.F.E. Center.

Sharps and medical waste do not

qualify under the VSQG Program. Please email Clean Harbors Healthcare Services: SharpsMedicalMailbackKitRequests@cleanharbors.com or call **800.344.1864**.

What information should I have when I call?

Please have your EPA ID number ready when you call. If you regularly generate any amount of hazardous waste, you are required to have an EPA ID number. Alternatively, a temporary EPA ID number can be obtained from the state if you do not regularly generate hazardous waste.

If you do not already have an EPA ID number, please call the Department of Toxic Substances Control at **1-800-618-6942** or visit <https://dtsc.ca.gov/hazardous-waste-id-numbers/> to register and receive your EPA ID number.

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
