5. CONSENT CALENDAR

- a. COMMITTEE MINUTES. A copy of the approved minutes of the Executive Committee meeting of April 2, 2025; the approved minutes of the Operations and Development Committee meeting of April 21, 2025; the approved minutes of the Finance and Administration Committee meeting of April 21, 2025, and copies of the approved minutes of the Legal, Government, and Environmental Affairs Committee meetings of April 7 and April 21, 2025 are included in the agenda packet for information purposes.
- b. COMMISSION MINUTES. A draft copy of the May 5, 2025, Commission minutes are included in the agenda packet for review and approval.
- c. TREASURER'S REPORT. The Treasurer's Report for February 2025, is included in the agenda packet. At its meeting on April 21, 2025, the Finance and Administration Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend that the Commission note and file this report.
- d. AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO AZRIAL LTD. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. At its meeting on May 5, 2025, the Operations and Development Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend that the Commission approve Amendment No. 1 to Azrial Ltd. Professional Services Agreement ("Agreement") to exercise the first of two one-year extension options for the Professional Services Agreement with Azrial Ltd., for continued AutoCAD, Geographic Information Systems, graphic display, and airport planning services.

The proposed Amendment is on a time-and-materials basis at an hourly rate of \$139.00 per hour, not to exceed 1,000 hours for a one-year extension period. An allowance of \$5,000 for miscellaneous out-of-pocket expenses, such as paper, ink, and reproduction costs, is included in the Agreement.

e. LAW ENFORCEMENT COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT – CITY OF BURBANK. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. At its meeting on May 5, 2025, the Legal, Government and Environmental Affairs Committee voted (2–0, 1 absent) to recommend that the Commission approve a revised Law Enforcement Cooperative Agreement with the City of Burbank as approved by the Burbank City Council on April 22, 2025. The Burbank Police Department and the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority Police Department share law enforcement jurisdiction at the Airport. The purpose of this mutual aid agreement is to set forth guidelines and responsibilities of the parties as they support each other.

a. AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE PURCHASE ORDER – ACQUISITION OF BACKUP EMERGENCY GENERATOR. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. Subject to the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks approval of the Commission to authorize Staff to issue a purchase order in the amount of \$88,618.82 to Multiquip Inc. for the purchase of an emergency backup generator for the Emergency Operations Center located in Building 3.

Burbank Hospitality Association (BHA) Meeting - April 16, 2025 SUBJECT:

- BHA completed their audit review for FY 2022-2023. The reports were approved by the Board and sent over to the City Manager's office and the City's Finance Director for final review.
- This meeting was primarily dedicated to selecting a new marketing agency and social media manager for Visit Burbank. The top three finalists from each category presented to the Board for final consideration. Verdin, a San Luis Obispo based agency with DMO and tourism experience was selected as the new marketing agency, and Lady Muse, a Los Angeles based content creator who currently manages social media for Downtown Burbank was selected as the new social media manager.

APRIL 16, 2025

A regular meeting of the Burbank Police Commission was held in the Council Chamber of City Hall, 275 East Olive Avenue, on the above date. The meeting was called to order at 1800 hours by Commission Chair Coomes.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM MARCH 19, 2025, MEETING

Commissioner Chapman made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Elman, to approve the minutes from the March 19th meeting. Motion carried with abstention by Commissioner Forouzan.

ITEMS OF BUSINESS

1. Presentation, discussion, and recommendations, if applicable, on efforts and strategies related to equity and inclusion in recruitment hiring and promotional processes

Lieutenant Green reviewed the goals and priorities of the Department's recruitment efforts, current demographics of personnel, policies related to hiring and promotional practices, training and professional development, and strategies to promote equity and diversity.

2. Presentation, discussion, and recommendations, if applicable, for an overview of the Communications Center

Captain Losacco described the call taking and dispatching process for non-emergency and 911 calls, staffing of the Center, and provided some notable stats:

- Average of 9-1-1 calls per year: 38,415
- Average of all incoming calls per year: 181,916
- Text to 9-1-1: approximately 60 per month
- 9-1-1 ring time: 94% of all 9-1-1 calls are picked up within 10 seconds

3. Presentation, discussion, and recommendations, if applicable, of the Pedestrian Safety Ad Hoc Subcommitee report

Commissioner Forouzan presented the highlights of the Subcommittee's report, spanning from January 2020 to May 2024. The report included stats on pedestrian/bicycle vs vehicle collisions,

at-fault designations, and primary collision factors. Commissioner Forouzan made three recommendations, based on an analysis the data presented:

- Education and enforcement efforts to reduce pedestrian injuries/fatalities, with focus on driver safety and responsibilities
- Education and enforcement efforts to reduce bicycle injuries/fatalities, with focus on both drivers and bicyclists, due to equivalent at fault ratios
- Education and enforcement efforts to reduce both pedestrian and bicycle injuries/fatalities along Glenoaks and other hot spots, such as the Empire Center and Costco

Chair Coomes made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McKenna, to provide the recommendations to the Department for consideration. Motion carried, with one vote in opposition by Commissioner Elman.
