Feeding coyotes - even unintentionally - teaches them to associate people with food. This leads to bold, dangerous behavior and puts coyotes at risk of being euthanized.

**FEEDING COYOTES IS NOT ALLOWED.
INDIVIDUALS CAUGHT FEEDING WILL BE CITED.**

IF YOU ENCOUNTER A COYOTE: **HAZE IT!**

Hazing teaches coyotes to be wary of people and that people are not a food source.
DON'T JUST OBSERVE

GET BIG - GET LOUD - SHOUT "GO AWAY COYOTE"



BE BIG

Face the coyote. Stand tall, raise your arms and open your jacket. Make yourself look as large as possible.



BE LOUD

Yell in a deep voice, clap your hands, blow a whistle or air horn.



HAZE

Slowly and confidently move toward the coyote to force it to leave. Don't run!



KEEP PETS CLOSE

Keep dogs close to you on a leash and under control. Never let pets approach or chase coyotes.



SECURE YOUR SPACE

Bring in pet food, don't leave trash out, and secure yards and coops - don't attract coyotes.
