

Summer 2024

A Community Engagement Plan launched; initial stakeholder outreach begins.

Fall 2024

Door-to-door outreach to nearby residents begins Engaged over 400 stakeholders at "Holiday in the Park" event

Winter 2025

Severe Windstorms cause significant damage to the venue, resulting in the cancellation of planned 2025 concerts events.

Continued neighborhood engagement and design previews with local stakeholder groups such as Burbank International Film Festival and Burbank Arts and Education Foundation.

Spring 2025

Launched Project Web Page on City Parks Website

Hosted 4 public Workshops for design feedback

Design Previews with Burbank Cultural Arts Commission and Burbank Association of Realtors.

Stakeholder Engagment at Police Fire Service Day and Downtown Burbank Arts Festival on Concept Design

Summer 2025

Concept Design previewed at the Parks and Recreation Board Meeting and the Burbank Chamber of Commerce.

Starlight on Tour Music and Movies in the Park is offered free to the community. Venue Programming and Operations Model Study completed and shared with the Burbank Cultural Arts Commission and Parks and Recreation Board.

Traffic consultant begins study of mitigation strategies.

Fall 2025

10/22 - Neighborhood Transportation Community Workshop

12/16 - Presentation to Burbank City Council, including recommendations for programming, operations, and transportation management of the venue, based on ongoing community input.

Begin Schematic Design based on feedback.

2026 & Beyond

Conduct feasibility studies and environmental review.

Host additional workshops and community meetings.

Finalize design and complete planning review process.




Bring-your-own food & drink with the option to purchase onsite

- Retain seating layout
- Priority access for season ticket holders
- Comfort-focused upgrades (roomier seats, cupholders, restrooms, Wi-Fi, etc.)
- Ticket price affordability
- Accessible & safe environment for all



Open Venue Model with Professional Management

- Hybrid approach modeled after the Santa Barbara Bowl & Greek Theatre
- Open booking for both community & commercial events
- Potential partnership with Burbank Cultural Arts Commission could ensure:
 - Community access for local artists & arts organizations
 - Arts funding from venue revenue
- Professional venue management relieves the City of day-to-day operations
- Balance of activity
 - City concerts, film nights, partner presentations, community use, & rentals

35 mainstage events = 11 commercial presentations + 24 community presentations





Draft Transportation Management Plan (TMP) Purpose


- Improve access to and from the Starlight Bowl
- Address and minimize traffic and parking effects on the surrounding neighborhood
- Minimize conflicts between ride-hailing (Uber, Lyft), shuttles, pedestrians, and private vehicles at/near the site
- Improve ride hail pick-up and drop-off
- Provide a shuttle alternative to Bowl

Existing Venue Access



- Vehicles access the venue via
 Walnut Avenue
 Bel Aire Drive (Employees)
 Harvard Rd/De Bell Dr
- Walking and biking is difficult due to the steep inclines
- Some attendees walk uphill along Walnut Ave, likely after being dropped off by ride-hail services near Sunset Canyon Dr

Proposed Private Vehicle Access



- Enter the parking lots via Walnut Ave and eastern driveway
 - Similar to existing operation
 - Signage directs drivers to Walnut Ave
- Stacked parking for highattendance events
- Exit via western driveway and Bel Aire Dr


Proposed Ride Hail Access



TCO = "Traffic Control Officer"

- Enter via Harvard Rd/De
 Bell Dr > Lockheed View Dr
 - Signage and geo-location direct ride-hail drivers
- Drop-off > pick-up along sidewalk, north side of Lockheed View Dr
- Exit via Bel Aire Dr

Proposed Remote Parking and Shuttle Access



- Overflow parking lots in Downtown Burbank
- Shuttles transport attendees to/from venue
- Shuttles **enter** via
 Orange Grove Ave >
 Bel Aire Dr >
 Harvard Rd>
 Sunset Canyon Dr >
 Walnut Ave
 - Exit via

 Bel Aire Dr >

 Cambridge Dr >

 Glenoaks Blvd




Ride Hail Route Post-Event

Permanent Signage Locations




- Permanent signage focused on operation

- Includes:
 - "No Stopping Any Time"
 - "Starlight Bowl Exit"
 - Numbered signage for ride-hail
 - "Starlight Bowl Parking Lot"

Proposed Temporary Signage Locations




- Temporary signage featured in both surrounding neighborhood an onsite/near the venue
- Neighborhood signage focused on directions for private vehicles, ride hail, and employees
- In neighborhood, includes:
 - "Starlight Bowl Employee Parking Lot ONLY"
 - "Starlight Bowl Parking ONLY"
 - "Starlight Bowl Drop-Off/Pick-Up on Harvard Rd"















