

A PROCLAMATION EXTENDING NEW SOCIAL DISTANCING RULES IN THE CITY OF BURBANK TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 BY DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES ISSUED ON MARCH 27, 2020.

The Director of Emergency Services of the City of Burbank does hereby find:

1. On March 13, 2020, a local emergency was declared in the City of Burbank due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
2. On March 17, 2020, the City Council by Resolution No. 20-29,135 confirmed the existence of the local emergency and confirmed the powers of the Director of Emergency Services to take all acts pursuant to Burbank Municipal Code Section 5-2-106 to protect life and property.
3. On March 19, 2020, the Los Angeles County Public Health Officer issued an Order entitled Safer at Home for Control of COVID-19 (Order). This Order encompassed rules for events and gathering, social distancing and closure of non-essential businesses and areas, as well as listing categories of essential businesses allowed to stay open under the Order.
4. On March 19, 2020, the Governor issued an executive order similar to the Safer at Home Order.
5. On March 21, 2020, the Los Angeles County Public Health Officer issued a revised Safer at Home for Control of COVID-19 Order which further restricted gatherings and changed categories of non-essential and essential businesses under the Order. The Order is effective through April 19, 2020.
6. On March 27, 2020, the Burbank Director of Emergency Services issued a social distancing order that in part prohibited the queueing of customers for essential businesses on the City's public right-of-way. This Order was set to expire on April 19, 2020.
7. The Los Angeles County Public Health Officer extended the Safer at Home Order to May 15, 2020.
8. Since the Safer at Home Order was extended, the need for the Social Distancing Order issued on March 27, 2020, is still necessary.
9. The extension of the Social Distancing Order is being issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Director of Emergency Services under Burbank Municipal Code Section 5-2-106 and is reasonably related and necessary to the protection of life and property as affected by the spread of COVID-19.

The Director of Emergency Services of the City of Burbank does hereby order:

- A. The Social Distancing Order on queueing in the public right-of-way issued on March 27, 2020, by the Director of Emergency Services is extended to May 15, 2020.
- B. Pursuant to Burbank Municipal Code Section 5-2-301 it is unlawful to commit any act forbidden by this order. Any person violating any of the provisions or failing to comply

with any of the mandatory requirements of this Code including violating this order may be guilty of a misdemeanor pursuant Burbank Municipal Code Section 1-1-105.

C. Social Distancing Order is effective April 20, 2020 through May 15, 2020, unless extended further. If Los Angeles County Public Health extends the Safer at Home Order beyond May 15, 2020, or issues a new Safer at Home Order that still prohibits non-essential businesses from operating or limits operations and continues essential businesses operations, then Social Distancing Order shall automatically extend to the termination date listed in any such County Safer at Home Order.

D. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Social Distancing Order is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this order.
