

A PROCLAMATION TERMINATING CURFEW ORDER
IN THE CITY OF BURBANK ISSUED BY DIRECTOR
OF EMERGENCY SERVICES ON MONDAY, JUNE 1,
2020.

The Director of Emergency Services of the City of Burbank does hereby find:

A. There has been widespread arson, looting, assaults, vandalism and rioting in the adjacent City of Los Angeles, and other nearby cities throughout Los Angeles County since May 30, 2020, and continuing to the present. Since at least May 28, 2020, there has also been widespread arson, looting, assaults, vandalism and rioting stemming from public demonstrations in numerous other cities throughout California and across the country.

B. Peaceful demonstrations are essential to our democratic system. During these protests, however, some individuals have engaged in dangerous and unlawful activity, threatening the safety of lawful demonstrators, surrounding businesses, communities, and first responders. Protests are continuing throughout Los Angeles County.

C. The above conditions constituted the existence of conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the City of Burbank; conditions which are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the City of Burbank and require the combined forces of other political subdivisions to combat. Based on these conditions, a local emergency within the City of Burbank was declared for the preservation of public health, safety and order on June 1, 2020.

D. Government Code Section 8634 and BMC Section 5-2-106 grants authority to the Director of Emergency Services to adopt orders and rules necessary for the protection of life and property, including orders imposing a curfew where necessary to preserve public order and safety. Based on the illegal behavior such as vandalism, looting and arson exhibited in the cities of Los Angeles, Santa Monica and Long Beach, and elsewhere in the County of Los Angeles, there is an imminent danger to people and property, which makes preservation of public safety and order even more difficult during hours of darkness.

E. Based on the foregoing, the County of Los Angeles has been issuing curfew orders on a daily basis since Sunday, May 31, 2020.

F. Also based on the foregoing, on June 1, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services issued an order providing in part:

"A curfew is imposed in the City of Burbank starting June 1, 2020, at 5:00 p.m. to 6:00. a.m. the following day and will remain in effect until lifted by order of the Director of Emergency Services or this emergency declaration lapses, whichever occurs first."

G. During the past two days, Burbank has experienced peaceful demonstrations. Arrests in the City, however, have increased for burglary and attempted burglary and other crimes related to civil unrest in neighboring jurisdictions.

H. On June 2, although there were protests throughout Los Angeles County including Burbank, events were peaceful and did not result in widespread vandalism, arson or burglaries that had occurred since May 30, 2020.


I. Los Angeles County has issued a county-wide curfew for June 3 starting at 9:00 p.m. and ending at 5:00 a.m. on June 4, 2020. This curfew is applicable in incorporated cities unless a city has a more restrictive curfew.

J. Based on the relative calm in Burbank and Los Angeles County on June 2, 2020, there is no longer a need for a separate more restrictive curfew in the City of Burbank.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED by the Director of Emergency Services of the City of Burbank:

1. The Curfew Order issued on June 1, 2020, by the Director of Emergency Services is hereby terminated.
